## A Gift from AAUW to Bowling Green

AAUW has certainly taken

root in Bowling Green. We now have an opportunity to etch the name of AAUW BG Branch into the permanent record of the Simpson Garden Park.

For those who have not heard of Simpson Garden Park, this is an inspiring project by the BG Parks and Recreation Department and BG Parks & Recreation Foundation to establish a wonderful garden park on 11 acres of land bordering Wintergarden Road and Conneaut Avenue. It promises to be a jewel in Bowling Green.

For the price of \$1000, AAUW can "endow" a tree in the Simpson Garden Park and have its name included on a plaque to be placed in the lobby of the Simpson Building. Part of each donation will be placed in an endowment to maintain the park once built. While \$1000 is a lot of money, we have 100 members. So an average of \$10 per member would enable us to reach that goal.

I know that AAUW is always asking members for money—for Educational Foundation, for the Legal Advocacy Fund, for local scholarships. So to make this easier, I will pledge to match donations by AAUW members toward this project up to \$500. Thus we only need to raise an average of \$5 per member. What a bargain—to be both helping a terrific project and perpetuating the name of AAUW as an organization in Bowling Green's history. Members may of course contribute more than \$5!

Some of you will be approached for individual or family gifts to the Simpson Garden Park. There will also be a "grassroots" campaign for smaller gifts. Each person's preferences will guide her participation in this project. But I hope that loyal

AAUW members will consider donating toward an AAUW gift.


#### Books! Books! Books!

#### CRITERIA FOR AWARDS

#### THE OUTSTANDING MEMBER OF THE BOWLING GREEN BRANCH:

- 1. Shall have been a member of the Bowling Green Branch for a minimum of three years.
- 2. Does not have to be a board member or have been a board member in the past.
- 3. Has maintained interest by participating in branch activities such as committee work, special projects, interest groups and branch meetings.
- 4. Has made outstanding contributions to on-going branch activities and/or special projects.

This service may be the result of paid or non-paid positions.
- 3. Shall have contributed to the enhancement of women in the community.
