Lunch with Bernice Sandler "The Godmother of Title IX"

BGSU Women's Center, BGSU School of Family & Consumer Sciences and Bowling Green Branch of AAUW hosted a lunch and conversation with **Dr. Bernice Sandler,** Senior Scholar at the Women's Research and Education Institute in Washington, DC on May 13, 2011. Bernice Sandler is internationally-recognized for her expertise in education equity. She made history at a time when no federal laws prohibited sex discrimination in education by filing the first charges of sex discrimination against more than 250 institutions.

This bold move led directly to the legislation that came to be known as **Title IX**. AND...both Sandler and

Title IX have a direct BGSU connection.



AAUW Bowling Green branch celebrated the contributions of outstanding women on Thursday, March 17th at 6pm at the Bowling Green Country Club. The branch awarded four outstanding women for their volunteer work, community engagements, and high professional achievements.

Janice Twork acts as the AAUW BG Branch Diversity/International/Global Affairs Chair. In addition, she cocoordinated the August 2010 Rhythm and Blues scholarship fundraising and the March 10, 2011 International Women's Day event. Other AAUW diversity collaborations with BGSU's Office of Multicultural Affairs (OMA) include the "Readings in Diversity" and "Project Mosaic" events.

As the Marketing and Retention Coordinator in the Office of Multicultural Affairs, she is known to her students as their "Success Coach." In 2008 she was the only Student Affairs professional that was acknowledged at the Vice Provost's Spring Recognition Reception as one of ten BGSU Outstanding Advisors. Throughout her professional life, Jan has worked with over thirteen thousand college students in helping them to achieve their academic and career goals. In addition, Janice is responsible for the promotion of OMA's diversity events and NCBI diversity education workshops at Bowling Green State University.

Linda Hobbs is a dedicated "behind the scenes" worker and for the past 4 years has done much to support the BG branch. A native of Houston, Texas, Linda spends some of her time in Ohio. She is a University of Texas graduate with a Bachelor of Business Administration in Finance. She is a successful real estate and business professional. Linda also spends a lot of time supporting organizations and individuals in their overall missions. For example, Linda

frequently spends Thanksgiving Day serving food to families at a local food bank in Houston.

In terms of AAUW, Linda has supported the production of the membership directory. Linda has tirelessly worked on formatting, checking member's names and addresses, and locating appealing images to include in the directory. Although Linda is not a highly visible member of our branch, she definitely exemplifies the goals, missions and objectives of AAUW.



A life-long social worker, Carol Fox c urrently is the director of the Court Appointed Special Advocate/ Guardian ad Litem (CASA/GAL) at the Wood County Juvenile Court in Bowling Green and oversees a quality volunteer based advocacy program for children who had been abused, neglect or dependent. She works tirelessly to secure funding. to train and mentor volunteers, and to ensure compliance with National Standards of practice. Over the years, Carol has made many connections with the community that resulted in ongoing projects including the Backpack Project in collaboration with the BGSU Honors Program. In addition, Carol developed a collaborative relationship with BGSU's School of Family and Consumer Sciences supervising student interns. Carol also obtained needed grant funds which enabled consultants to provide training for Friends of CASA members and led to the redevelopment of this

non-profit support board which is active in community outreach on behalf of the Wood Co. CASA program including the Karen Swartz Memorial Walk for CASA, Champion of Child annual award, and a PCA BGSU/Friends of CASA Light of Hope Art Show.

Janet Parks is distinguished teaching professor emerita, former graduate studies coordinator, and former sport management division chair at Bowling Green State University in Ohio. She was a founding member of the North American Society for Sport Management (NASSM), which has honored her with the Earle F. Zeigler Award for Professional Achievement (1992) and the NASSM Distinguished Service Award (2001). She is the recipient of the Outstanding Achievement Award from the Sport Management Council (SMC) of the National Association for Sport and Physical Education (NASPE) and the President's Award from the National Association for Girls and Women in Sport (NAGWS).

Janet has written and produced Title IX: Implications for Women in Sport and Education, a three-disc DVD set designed for classroom use.

She also tirelessly volunteers for several social service agencies in her community including the Cocoon Shelter, "Save the Woods" campaign, and the local AmeriCorps.
